CONCURRENT JURISDICTION

POLICY

The Honolulu Police Department (HPD) shall cooperate with and support other law enforcement agencies in areas of concurrent jurisdiction to provide the best possible law enforcement services to the community.

PROCEDURE

I. DEFINITION

Concurrent jurisdiction exists when two or more law enforcement agencies have shared authority to conduct investigations or take other law enforcement actions within the same geographical area.

II. CONCURRENT JURISDICTION OPERATING GUIDELINES

The HPD shares concurrent jurisdiction with federal, state, and military law enforcement agencies. Provisions for concurrent jurisdiction are found in the United States-- Hawaii Statehood Act, 16(b) (1959), Act Mar. 18, 1959, Pub. L. No. 86-3; Section 52D-5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes; and Section 6-1604 of the Revised Charter of Honolulu.

- A. When dispatched and/or responding to an incident in an area of concurrent jurisdiction, officers shall provide for emergency medical assistance, preserve the scene, make notifications, and investigate the incident in accordance with established departmental directives. Attached is a list of telephone numbers for locations where concurrent jurisdiction may apply.

- B. An investigation may be transferred to another agency in accordance with departmental directives or by mutual agreement.
- C. If a conflict arises over jurisdiction, officers shall provide services if they are within their authority and ability to do so. Police services shall not be delayed or hindered by jurisdictional issues.
- D. If there are any jurisdictional issues to be resolved, they shall be addressed through the chain-of-command at a later time.
- E. Intergovernmental memorandums of agreement pertaining to law enforcement activities in areas of concurrent jurisdiction shall be approved by the Department of the Corporation Counsel and the City Council.
