The Law Enforcement Explorer Program (LEEP) is for young adults ages **14-20 years old** who are interested in a career in law enforcement.

### Explorers Develop:

### Requirements

- Maintain a school GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Complete a background check (no prior arrests or serious traffic violations)
- Be a person of good conduct and high moral character
